Welcome to the Town of Minamiechizen

Minamiechizen is a town located in almost the exact center of Fukui Prefecture. Minamiechizen was born in 2005 following the merger of three towns and villages (former towns of Nanjo, Imajo, and Kono of the Nanjo District). With a population of approximately 11,200 people (as of 2015), the town as a vast land area that covers approximately 343 square kilometers.

Catch phrase representing the three areas of Minamiechizen.

San (mountain), Kai (ocean), and Ri (basin).
The Imajo area, Kono area, and Nanjo area are represented by the distinct characteristics of the mountains, ocean, and mountain basin, respectively.



The highlights of tourism in Kono is the history of kitamaebune and the structures related to their history. During the time, Ukonke was a powerful kitamaebune ship owner. That home currently serves as a historical materials hall. The "Kono kitamaebune street" that extends to the north from the Ukonke is a famous place worth a visit.



This former road to the north of Ukonke is called Kono kitamaebune street. It conveys the history of a time when the kitamaebune thrived.

Ukonke Museum Kitamaebune Archives Center MAP D-3
From the Edo Era to the Meiji Era, kitamaebune were ships used by ship owners (merchant ships) that traveled from Hokkaido to Shimonoseki, Setouchi, and to Osaka (western corridor). Kono was home to many ship owners and in particular the Ukon and Nakamura families became wealthy families by increasing their ships from the end of the Edo Era into mid-Meiji Era. Currently, the Ukonke home currently serves as a historical materials hall.



The Echizen coast
The Echizen coast travels along the Echizen Kaga Coast National Park, which offers views of natural rock formations created by the wind and waves. This is one of the most famous views in Fukui.
Suisen Festival (Wild Wave Festival) January
Featuring the sale of ocean produce, the Echizen crab are quite popular.

Ukonke Western Hall
Located on the plateau behind the Ukonke, this hall completed in 1935 epitomized the Western trends of the time. The grand view from the veranda is a must-see.



A feature of tourism in the Imajo area is the culture surrounding the mountains. As a valley area, the Imajo lodges thrived as a bed town along the northern road and the severe natural environment gave birth to a unique lifestyle, including the cultivation of soba (buckwheat).



Kaido-roman Imajo-shuku
September
Events that relive the romantic age of Imajo. Experience dancing the Imajo Haneso style of dance, which has been designated a Prefectural Intangible Cultural Asset.

In the Edo Era, this area thrived as a bed town along the northern corridor that connected modern day Shiga Prefecture to Echizen Imajo (Fukui Prefecture) and Naotsu (Niigata Prefecture). The area has much of the landscape and historical sites that paint a portrait of the period.



Imajo Soba
One of the most famous places for soba noodles in the prefecture. The cold soba with radish is very popular. Each shop has a unique flavor. Definitely a must-try.

A bed town that was the location of a checkpoint in the Edo Era. The thatched roofs are a style known as "Kabuto-zukuri".

Imajo Soba Festival
May
Imajo Soba Festival offers a chance to try various types of Imajo soba noodles. There are also special goods sales and an event stage.
Location: Imajo 365 Ski Area



The highlight of tourism in the Nanjo area are the lotus flowers that decorate the summer plains. Boasting Japan's largest production volume of lotus flowers and located at the foot of the Somayama Castle site, the Hanahasu Park welcomes many visitors each summer.



Hanahasu Park MAP 20 B-4
Hanahasu Park features some 130 types of flowers from around the world. Particularly popular in the summer months when flowers are in full bloom, the park features a rest area called the Uryu Hall, an exhibit space, and a grass area and fort for children.

Hasu Festival July-August
Features drinks that are drunk with a lotus stem in place of a straw. Events include drink from lotus flower petals and creating washi paper from lotus fiber. The area is also popular for photography.

Myotaiji Temple MAP 20 B-3
Daikokusan Myotaiji Temple has a history that goes back over 700 years. One of the most renowned temples in Hokuriku. The temple features an inner ground that extends 200m from the main gate. Recommending viewing includes the Niomon featuring numerous Buddhist statues, the Sanju hallway, and the main hall.

Shichifukujin Festival (Myojinka) September
The history of the Shichifukujin Festival is over 200 years old. A rare festival in which people wear Shichifukujin masks and parade through the streets.

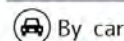

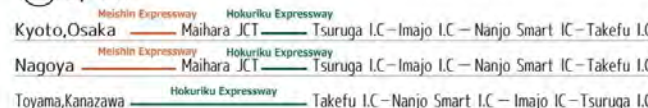

9 Somayama-jo-ato Ruins of a castle



A mountain castle where you can feel the history of famous battlegrounds. A hiking course where you can experience history.

Somayama Castle is a mountain castle built in the Kamakura Era at the top of a mountain at 492m that served as the entryway to Echizen. After numerous wars, the castle was destroyed after the attack on Hokuriku by Nobunaga Oda in 1573. Every part of the area, including the pond and building remnants are specified as national historical sites. There is a hiking course that can be climbed in about 90 minutes from the foot of the mountain.

Info There also is a mountain course that allows you to climb halfway up the forest road by car (approx. 40 mins.).

11 Shikisai Roadside Station



A store offering a wide variety of seasonal vegetables. Also available are prepared dishes and gifts.

Shikisai is a local shop that offers seasonal vegetables, prepared dishes, Kohno ocean produce, and gifts. We recommend shopping for vegetables in the morning as the shop is popular with customers. The prepared dish corner offers lunch boxes made using organically-grown rice, dishes handmade locally, and sweets such as daifuku and bota mochi are very popular.

Info The shop offers a relaxing space to enjoy your meal (8 chairs). The Nanjo Historical Materials Hall (free entry) is just a one minute walk away.

13 Imajo 365 Ski Area



A ski area with 8 courses and a total of 2100m in length that offers views of the Sea of Japan.

From the top of the mountain, the Imajo 365 Ski Area has views of the Sea of Japan and Hakusan mountain range. Enjoy a panoramic view of grand nature while skiing. There are 8 courses for everyone from beginners to experts as well as sled course specifically for children. While for skiing only during the day, you can also enjoy snowboarding at night.

Info During the off season (from Apr. to the middle of Nov.), the area offers ground golf on natural grass and a barbecue area.

15 Kono Seaside Onsen Yubae Hot Spring



A salt bath for healthy skin. A scenic hot spring with a view of the ocean from the bath.

Located along National Highway 305, a major route that allows you to drive along the Echizen coast, this convenient day-use hot spring is just a two minute walk from the Kaburaki seaside resort. The water from the hot spring has a high sodium content that leaves your skin feeling moist and healthy. A hot spring offering a view of the even sun setting into the Sea of Japan, guests can enjoy vast views from the bath.

Info The grand hall on the second floor features an ordering system that allows guests to enjoy seasonal ocean fare via an order and delivery system that connects guests with local restaurants.

10 Yasha-ga-ike Lake



One of the most popular hiking courses in the prefecture. A mystical figure at the top of a mountain.

Located on the prefectural borders of Fukui and Gifu at an altitude of 1,099m, this lake has a depth of 7m and a circumference of 230m. The lake was the site of rainmaking rituals in ancient times. The area has a unique ecosystem, including the yasha-gengoro (a kind of diving beetle), which is on the verge of extinction. The surrounding area is covered by virgin forest, allowing visitors to enjoy the views of each season.

Info Each year in early June, the mountain is opened and a "Safety Ceremony" is conducted to pray for hiker safety.

The Kono roadside station is located along major National Highway 8, and recommended for the rest stop. The Kono roadside station is a clean, spacious facility offering gifts, food, a rest area, tourism information, a large public toilet, and more. Gifts and food featuring various marine produce, including the famous Crab Bowl and Mackerel Heshiko, are popular with tourists.

A day use hot spring that is a 1 minute walk from the Imajo 365 Ski Area. Adjacent are lodging facilities and cottages. The hot spring with aroma of sulfur will warm the body. The open air bath offers a full view of nearby mountains. A hot spring surrounded by vast nature that will leave you feeling free and relaxed. A place of rest for skiers in the winter and outdoor enthusiasts in the summer.

Info Adjacent to the hot spring is Lodge 365, a Japanese-style lodging facility, and Alpine Rose 365, which can accommodate up to 6 people per unit.

A hot spring facility with lodging accommodations located next to Hanahasu Park. The hot spring is an alkaline-base pure spring that is referred to as a spring for beautiful skin. Also includes a dining establishment where you can enjoy hasu (lotus)-based foods and other local flavors. The indoor bath includes a "lotus bath" containing lotus extract and the shop features various lotus-based gifts. A hot spring featuring the lotus at every turn.

Info On the grounds is a tennis court (3 courts) and a barbecue area that are available for non-lodging guests as well.

Close to the JR Imajo Station, this lodge is convenient as the starting point for walking and cycling. Bicycles are available for rental. Used for ayu (sweetfish) fishing, mountain climbing, skiing, lodging, and group trips. The Wazen traditional meal featuring local ayu, seasonal vegetables, and mountain vegetables is very popular.

Info With 13 Japanese-style and 9 Western-style rooms, the lodge can accommodate a total of 87 people. The lodge also features a grand hall for workshops and banquets.

 A facility surrounded by vast nature that provides nature experiences. Inside the facility is an experiential classroom and an exhibition space that introduces Imajo agriculture and culture. The area surrounding the facility features a camping ground, a barbecue pit, a riverside play area, lodges, and other outdoor facilities. Upstream along the nearby Akatanigawa River is the Akatan sand control dams, which is designated as a National Historical Site.

Info The "Soba Buffet" held each month is popular for all-you-can-eat Imajo soba (usually on 3rd weekend of the month, inquiries required).
